- Ensure item authenticity with necessary certificates.
- □ Special handling for fragile antiques.
- Climate-controlled storage for sensitive items.
- □ Secure storage for valuable items.
- ¬ Fire safety precautions and extinguishers in place.
- □ Regular cleaning to protect from dust and pests.
- □ Optimal lighting to showcase items without damage.
- Adequate insurance coverage for items on sale.
- □ Clearly labelled items with information and price.
- □ Safe and transparent payment methods.
- □ Clearly marked and unblocked emergency exits.
- □ Regular staff training on handling and care of antiques.
- □ Efficient inventory tracking system.
- □ CCTV surveillance for security.
- □ Anti-theft systems in place.
- □ Dedicated customer service and enquiry section.
- Safe and equipped area for antique restorations, if offered.
- □ Regular pest control checks.
- □ Secure and stable shelving/display units.
- □ Flooring clear of trip and slip hazards.
- □ First Aid kit available and accessible.
- □ Proper break areas for staff.
- \Box Clear return and refund policy.
- □ Guidelines on item handling for customers.
- □ Public liability insurance in place.
- □ If selling online, proper online security measures.
- \square Data protection and GDPR compliance.
- \square Regular audits of items and financial transactions.
